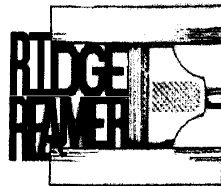

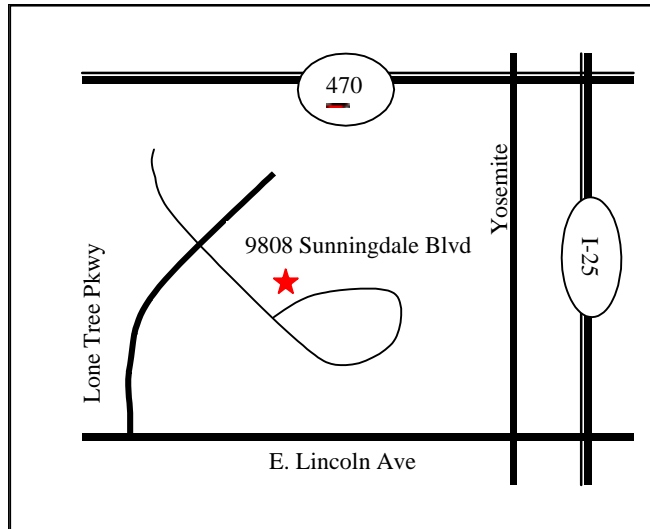
2002 PLANNED EVENTS

How To Change The Oil In Your Car...

Women:

1. Pull up to Jiffy Lube when the mileage reaches 3000 since the last oil change.

31. Cuss for additional 10 minutes because wrench hit Miss Decembert(1992) on the left thigh.
32. Clean up; apply Band-Aid to knuckle.
33. Beer.
34. Beer.
35. Dump in additional 4 quarts of oil.
36. Beer.
37. Lower car from jack stands.
38. Accidentally crush one of the jack stands.
39. Move car back to apply more oil lift (AKA kitty litter) to fresh oil spilled during step 23.
40. Drive car.
41. Feel proud, you did it all yourself.

BOARD MINUTES

December 2, 2002 RMTTC Board Meeting

Present: Mike Cline, Gordon Kenney, Bob Becwar, Eric Conrad, Marietta Coon and guests were newly elected board members Ken Kalin and Rod Tomkins.

Mike called the meeting to order at 7:06 PM and started with officer reports.

Gordon reported that flowers were sent to Scott Keller. He has confirmed reservations at Piccolo's for the Board meeting in Jan. and Feb. and for the monthly meeting in Feb. The issue of revising the MOY voting to allow all members (including officers) was discussed. Rod suggested creating an Officer MOY and

MOY at large. It was to defer the decision until the next board meeting or later.

Bob distributed a treasurer's report. He now has a home FAX if you wish to send him information. See the written treasurers report in the newsletter for details. We discussed the issue of organizing as a not-for-profit so that we could put the clubs cash balance in an interest bearing account. Bob will get the signature cards for the new officers.

He said we are set for the Xmas party and he has gotten the soft drinks; Mike will get the turkey and ham and Kevin needs to bring the tickets. We need to locate coffee urns. Dorthy H. will bring six table centerpieces and those will be given

away at the end of the party; she also has paper table covers. He raised the issue of hors'dourves and is asking for someone to bring those; Rod and Marietta volunteered to do so. Bob will collect the \$5/person and distribute the tickets for the gift exchange. We will not do a raffle at either the Christmas party or the Jan. banquet.

Marietta reported we have 172 members with the number being lower due to members not paying their renewal dues. If members are in arrears at the end of December they will not be in the new membership roster. We clarified that Shawn Loseke has in fact paid dues and should not have been dropped from the newsletter mailings. She has rewritten the by-laws to correct spelling errors before printing in the new roster. She distributed a draft copy to each attendee for their review and asked they submit corrections to her by December 14th. We reviewed the number of newsletter needed and decided to print 160 next time.

Eric reported that the newsletter will go out Wednesday; he is listing Dave Fain as volunteer webmaster. We reviewed the list of technical advisors and made some changes (see newsletter).

Mike talked about the Saturday

event to the North Pole and Eric will send out an e-mail to those on the e-mail list. The Denver group will meet at 8:30 AM at Gunther Toody's.

Following the officer reports Gordon reported on arrangements for the January 2003 Banquet at Lone Tree. The deposit has been made and the contract has been signed. The newsletter contains a sign up form including the mailing address. Terry Hughes is donating a "car related gift" to each of the attendees. Gordon will print calendars for each couple and is also preparing a Power Point review of the 2002 year. Mike will arrange for the LCD projector. The determination of individuals to receive certificate recognition at the banquet was discussed. It was agreed that Marty and Rod will develop the list of those who have hosted or organized an event or others who have made outstanding contributions to the club. Gordon will print the certificates. Marietta will take care of getting the Member of the Year trophy engraved and she will get a gavel for the outgoing Prime Minister.
