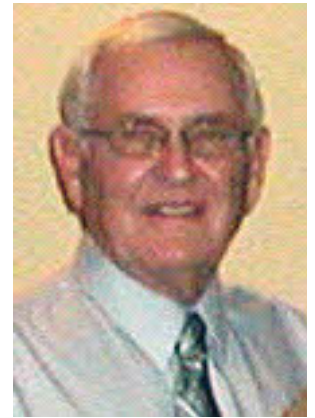

Board Meeting, Feb. 1, 2010 @ Red Rocks Grill

Meeting called to order at 7:02 PM.

Present Ralph Malewska, Sean DeBow, Steve Hart, Janet Cline, Gordon Kenney, Dave Fain, Silvio DeBartolomeis, Lynette Kirkham, and Andy DeVisscher.

Discussion about 2010 roster. It has numerous errors. We may want to reprint it. Only about 20 copies have been distributed. Discussion on how other clubs issue rosters. Silvio moved that we issue a corrected roster condensed onto sheets that will fit into a future copy of the newsletter. Ralph suggested publishing club bylaws, member of the year rules and other stuff that usually goes into the roster be distributed in a future newsletter. Motion carried.

Discussion on whether to keep membership roster in Excel or change to a data base program. Consensus is that we can leave it on Excel, take the data and print a roster, then convert it to .pdf format so we can distribute it easily.

They have a larger room available but they didn't tell us about it until after the banquet. The swag in the raffle was nice, we got some nice donations from sponsors. Lynette will communicate with Red Rocks CC and get back to us next month. We will vote on whether to return next year at a future meeting. James DeBartolomeis is interested in doing the slide show next year. Photos should be sent to James. We may want to make the slide show available to the membership on a DVD for a nominal charge.

Gordon suggested having a representative from RMVR at the next meeting. Terry and Brooks also want to discuss VTR 2011. They have a video of a previous VTR convention but it may run kind of long. Consensus was that we can fit it both if they limit the length of their presentations.

Discussion on member of the year. Gordon suggested continuing to ignore mileage driven since nobody seems to be turning it in anyhow. Ralph moved that we just eliminate that factor. Motion carried.

Silvio discussed events. See newsletter for more information. Silvio proposed doing a Lariat Loop tour and inviting other clubs. Spring car show Sunday May 16. Steve suggested inviting Saab 99 and Morgan Plus 4 since they have Triumph engines, in addition to the TVR's we already invite. Motion passed. Discussion on Father's Day picnic. Suggestions made on having events closer to Colorado Springs. Suggestion on having a dust & shine at Tebo museum in Longmont. Steve suggested a car collection in Colorado Springs.

Discussion on possibly moving board meetings somewhere more "centrally located". Andy discussed buying regalia and raffle swag. Janet suggested stocking larger sizes.

Meeting adjourned at 8:33 PM.

Detailing Tech Session

On February 20, sixteen RMTC members braved the falling snow and cold to visit an interesting car collection/car business model in a Lakewood office park. The LeMay family of Seattle has built combination office, garage, showroom buildings called “Club Auto” in select cities in order to raise money for the construction of a museum to house the world’s largest car collection—the LeMay Collection. The Lakewood building has offices housing a dozen or so car-related companies, including The Intrigue Detail.

A collection of high-end collector cars owned by local LeMay Museum members fills the showroom. Before the detailing tech session began, we ogled the beautifully restored, award-winning cars. Amid a sea of Ferraris were several British cars—Jags, Rolls, Bentley—but no Triumphs! The Porsche 550 Spyder is one VIN number higher than the one that actor James Dean died in. A highlight was the 1959 Indy 500-winning race car, complete with the original tires that crossed the finish line 50 Memorial Days ago. On a rack in the garage was a 1956 Chevy custom 2-door sedan purchased at the 2010 Barrett-Jackson Auction.

Our host, Justin Blackburn of the Intrigue Detail, related the history of the LeMay Collection and of his business. After donuts, juice, coffee, and questions, we adjourned to the shop/car storage garage for demonstrations of proper polishing, waxing, metal finishing, and interior and exterior detailing techniques.

After the tech session, we adjourned to the Yard House at Colorado Mills for lunch and a selection of draft beers without peer. A great time was had by all despite the weather. THANKS, SILVIO, for planning another very enjoyable event!

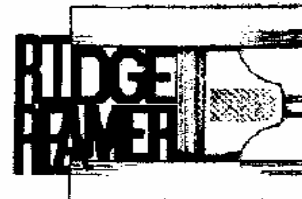

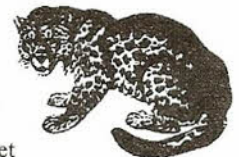

In January 1936, Triumph decided to split car and motorcycle production into two separate and independent companies. John Young Sangster bought the Priory Street (motorcycle) works for 5,000 pounds and assembly-line workers took a cut in pay. Sangster changed the motorcycle company name to Triumph Engineering Company, which he had registered in 1906.

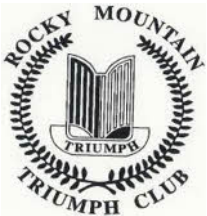
