Rocky Mountain Triumph Club – Motoring Challenge

The purpose of the Challenge is for RMTC members to get out and DRIVE their Triumphs instead of just admiring them in a garage or at a show. Prizes, yes prizes, will be awarded based on points totals amassed at the end of the challenge.

The time frame for the contest this year is from April 1, (no fooling!) to November 1. Participants need to register their name and vehicle with Mark Bosler. All official Challenge sheets and photos must be submitted to Mark Bosler by the RMTC Board Meeting, November 6, 2017. Photos should be submitted by email with an identifying caption if necessary to Mark Bosler. Submitted photos may be used in a slide show at the RMTC Christmas Party/Meeting.

Photo and Point Guidelines

- Earn points by taking photos of your car in front of or near the identifying signs of destinations and points of interest listed on the back of this guide.
- Photos should include yourself and/or a traveling companion when possible.
- Your car – eligible vehicles are RMTC Member Triumphs or collector LBCs.
- Proof of your location such as signs or identifying landmarks or structures.
- The cover of a 2017 RMTC Herald Newsletter needs to be in the picture. A helpful hint, either print a cover on card stock, or mount it on a clipboard to prop against the windshield, side or rear window.

Photos must have clearly identifiable, permanently posted signs, buildings or structures. We want you, or a navigator to be in as many pictures as possible. Be creative, it could earn you bonus points with the judges. All destinations are worth one point, except where noted. Some photos could be challenging to come by, and though this is a Motoring “Challenge”, be safe out there.

RMTC Challenge Guide Notes

Each destination in the guide is worth one point, except where noted.

- On the Challenge Guide identify the general location where Points of Interest were located, ie. B-52 Bomber - Wings Over the Rockies Museum.
- For Places of Mother Nature and Mountain Peaks and Passes the sign is all-important.
- For Counties, “Entering” signs, or signs on public building and structures should be used.

Bonus Points

Judges may add bonus points for any number of artistic, creative or clever reasons.

February 6, 2017

Deb called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Board Reports:

Jeff – reviewed the events scheduled until June and updated everything else we knew about that had not been put on the schedule.

Marla – went over P & L. She is double checking some items and will let the board know the outcome.

Eric - did not have anything.

Kitty – we have 108 members. There are 8 memberships that are past due and were moved to lapsed members.

Mark – he is trying to consolidate old records and archives to reduce paper.

New Business –

Car show

Andrej spoke to the Board about the Spring Car Show and his ideas as to how to make the show more engaging and interesting.

The venue would be donated. Two of the locations were the Vault in Parker, where he would bring in food trucks and The Bee at the Broadmoor in Colorado Springs. He has a contact at The Bee. Lunch would come from the entry fee and charitable donations. Goody bags would also come from donations.

He is looking for a team of 5 club members. He indicated that he already has his wife and daughter on board, so would be looking at the membership to make up the rest of the team. He will work on getting dates and costs. Thinking that the event would be so good that it would follow into next year. Andrej also brought up a sound system that he will research a bit more and report back via email to the Board.

Terry proposed vote for Andrej to move forward; Marla seconded and the board voted in favor unanimously.

Xmas Party

Kitty updated the Xmas party for 2017 at The Arbor House, which is located at W 32nd Ave and I-70.

It can seat 65 people. The cost of \$325.00 included alcohol permits. It has a full kitchen so we could do either a potluck or have it catered. We have reserved the date of Saturday, December 9th from 5pm to 10pm. There is a \$200.00 refundable deposit due in November. We would set up between 4:30 and 5pm and cleanup between 10-10:30pm. She did get a discount on the room. Motion proposed by Jeff and seconded and unanimous among the Board. The venue is decorated for the holiday season.

CD Rollover

Marla was able to obtain the rates. The interest rates continue to be low, however, we do not want to lock up the \$10,827.59 in case we do the VTR. A decision was made to put \$11,000.00 into a Premier Time Deposit and keep rolling it every 6 months. The interest rates are currently yielding .10 -.70. Jeff motioned, Kitty seconded and the Board voted unanimously.

Deb spoke a bit about our focus for 2017. She would like to invite other British clubs to our events. Terry was going to research maps of the mountains and back roads and see how much money they are or if they can be downloaded electronically.

July and September board meeting dates will be changed due to holidays. Monday, July 3rd meeting will be moved to July 10th. September 4th meeting is Labor Day and will be moved to Tuesday 9/5.

Discussion for Member of the year to possibly have 1st, 2nd and 3rd place awards so there will be more opportunity for members to get something. Board will consider and vote on it at a later time.

Poster conception for our vendors was mentioned to Andrej.

Other events:

CCCC swap meet will be on May 27th. Havana cruise will be on June 10th. Jeff is adding to the calendar. Dave and Arlene will host the annual Oktoberfest on Saturday Sept 30th in the afternoon.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:00 pm.

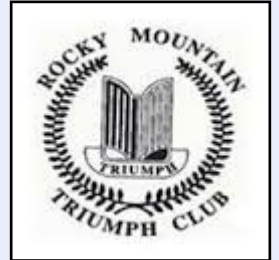
