### June 24th – A High Plains Ramble On

Sunday, June 24 we will do a 100+ mile ramble across the eastern Colorado High Plains. We will meet in the Aspen Grove Shopping Center off South Santa Fe in Littleton, near the Chick-Fil-A at 9:45 am for a 10:00 am departure. There is a Panera Bread and a Starbucks in the shopping center if you need pre-ramble fortification.

We will then motor south to Castle Rock, and on to Franktown, Elizabeth, and Kiowa where we will lunch at Bino's Cafe, with pizza and beer. From there we will go north to Strasburg for an enlightening afternoon about Commanche Crossing, the Union Pacific Monument, and a John Deere Tractor and Irrigation Museum.

Detailed route instructions will be provided, plus re-group areas, as there are many intersections, turns, and stop lights on the way.
