
RMTC's Ultimate Colorado





1. How did you get interested in cars?

When I was about 12, I used to steer my Dad's 1927 REO and that got me interested in driving.

2. What were some of your favorite cars you've owned? My 1st car was a 1936 Oldsmobile straight-8 sedan. Then I had a 1951 Ford V-8, 2 door sedan. A friend in the service had a TR2 and that got me interested in Triumphs.

3. What was your first Triumph?

A 1956 Triumph TR3 with overdrive, red with a white top. I got married in 1957 and my wife Marcia and I went to watch sportscar races in Pomona, Riverside Raceway and Santa Barbara, CA. In 1958 my wife wrecked that car when I was stationed overseas in Iwakuni, Japan. When I got back stateside' I got a new 1960 TR3 with overdrive and wire wheels, black with black interior and white trim. We drove this car across country from CA to PA in 1960 and averaged 34 mpg. It was a fun car to drive. We sold that car when our daughter was born in 1962.

4. How did you find the Rocky Mountain Triumph Club?

I heard about the club from the previous owner of this 1961 TR3 I purchased in July and thought it would be interesting to meet other Triumph sportscar owners.

Bob is attending an Honor Flight on October 11-13 this year, his daughter wrote this bio *[edited for space]*; After the Marines, Bob became an auto mechanic and specialized in automatic transmissions. During his time in the Marine Corps he had several different motorcycles and became passionate about Harleys. That passion encouraged Bob to open a Harley-Davidson franchise in Santa Maria, CA in April 1977. He sold the Harley Shop in 1988 and started driving a truck for Rodeway across the Western United States. Bob retired in 2003.
