Laws Whiskey House Tour - Hosted and Reported by Andrew & Kitty Janiesch

According to our fabulous Laws Whiskey House Tour guide, Julia, "Beer wants to be whiskey when it grows up!" Fourteen RMTC members took the February 23rd Laws Whiskey House tour. This distillery is located in the historic Gates Neighborhood. Julia gave us an in-depth presentation on the company's history, ownership, and the process of making craft whiskey. She then escorted us through the distillery and showed us the mill house where the grains are milled, combined and then cooked, to create a complex sour mash. This sour mash is then open-air fermented. We were able to get up close & personal with this fermenting process. Then we saw how this mash is distilled in a four plate pot/column, (custom made by Vendome Copper Works), and then transferred into American White Oak barrels, where it's aged until perfection. After the tour, we were treated to a quick lesson on how to properly taste their 4 Grain Whiskey and their Rye. This tour cost each person \$10, though as an added perk, after the tour and tasting, each participant received a \$10 chip. This chip could be used to purchase your tasting glass or \$10 off from their stuff in their gift shop!

Please contact me if you are willing to join the Exploratory Committee.



67th Annual Rallye Glenwood Springs, June 7-9, 2019 Celebrating 90 years of MG Sports Cars







The MG Car Club - Rocky Mountain Centre invites you to join us for the 67th Annual Rallye Glenwood Springs, the oldest continually-held time-speed-distance (TSD) rally in the United States, on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday, June 7, 8, & 9, 2019.

The Rallye Glenwood Springs weekend is a marvelous opportunity, not just for MG owners, but for sports car enthusiasts of every mark (British, American, German, Italian, Japanese) to come together for sunny days, cool nights, and unique events. The fun begins on Friday with a time-speed-distance rally to challenge both novice and experienced rallyists from the Denver suburb of Littleton, rallying through canyons and over mountain passes in the heart of the Rocky Mountains to the scenic resort town of Glenwood Springs. Saturday's main event is a tour winding through the beautiful mountain valleys around Glenwood Springs. The weekend culminates with a social gathering Saturday night and the Car Show, Funkhana, and Awards Presentation on Sunday. Pre-WWII MGs are featured this year.

Since its inception, the MGCC-RMC has sponsored this Rallye, which began when a hardy group of sports car owners discovered the joys of motoring in Colorado in MGs that still had drop-down tops and running boards. The Rocky Mountains of central Colorado, with some of the most breathtaking scenery in America, have formed the backdrop for the Rallye Glenwood Springs through 66 previous years. Vintage and classic cars from as far away as California and Illinois have shared the twisting mountain roads with their newer counterparts for octane-related festivities. And enthusiasts have come from as far away as England to drive their sports cars through such fabled Colorado mining towns as Leadville and Aspen on their way to Glenwood Springs.

Registration is only \$75 for all the driving events and the car show, or \$25 if you choose to enter only the car show (before May 20; social event and regalia are extra). 



Minutes of the RMTC-LLC Board Meeting of Feb. 4th, 2019 by Gordon Kenney, Minister of Letters

Prime Minister Debbie Bosler called the meeting to order at 6:35 pm; others present were R. Tomkins, G. Kenney, J. Heller, K. Janiesch, A. Janiesch, D. Durstine and M. Bosler.

A new copy of the clubs debit card has been obtained; its monthly cost and the persons authorized for its use were discussed, and Jeff will verify authorized signers for it and for the checking account. That bank account has been converted to an on-line account. He also distributed a detailed financial summary of 2018 and of the beginning of 2019. The 2018 final report shows a net loss of \$109.42. Jeff has completed the Colorado Income tax return for 2018.

Andrew reported on the recent Chili party and discussed the upcoming whiskey tour on the 23rd. He also will be listing an event similar to "Cars and Coffee" which will be held on March 9th at the "Vehicle Vault" in Parker. It may include a museum tour followed by lunch at the "Hickory House BBQ" nearby. Gordon reported that Bob Klie had told him the annual "St Francis, KS" car show may not be held this year; Bob will keep us posted. There is an alternate show in Burlington that the club could do and still go to the Klies farm for dinner afterward.

Kitty reported that we have 111 current members and she is updating the membership list. It was decided that the club <u>Roster will only be distributed as an "e-mail</u>" unless someone is paying to receive the newsletter by mail, and has no email address. This is due to the high charges to print / mail a document this large.

Rod reviewed the upcoming "Drive Your Triumph Day" and some other potential drives this spring. In March the monthly program will include Gordon showing a 20 minute video of the career of Janet Guthrie which was filmed last summer at the Aspen track.

Gordon said Alan Magnuson wanted to come to the Feb. general meeting to talk about the June 9th Glenwood Springs Rallye although it does conflict with the ACC show. He also received approval to continue the MOY program as previously defined.

The February newsletter carries minutes of both the previous meetings of the board and of the general membership. It was agreed to continue to publish these reports in the newsletter.

David reported that the board review of the draft newsletter was helpful and thanked all who contributed. He is always looking for stories and photos for the newsletter. Regular contributors are much appreciated!

Debbie asked the board members to review the 2016 copy of the RMTC By-Laws prior to the next board meeting to
