





British Sports Werks Open House Celebrating the Move to Estes Park

With an introduction provided by Kevin Spooner

I founded BSW in 2005 after working in High Tech for 18 years, and accumulating what was/is likely the largest collection of NOS and used British parts north of Denver, and becoming well known amongst the local British car enthusiasts.

BSW opened in a 4,000 sq ft shop in Windsor, where the business grew rapidly until the economic crash of 2008. In 2009 I moved the business to the 2,400 sq ft shop at my house, just north of Greeley, where it recovered from the poor economy. In 2017 I started the process of moving BSW to a 3,200 sq ft shop in Estes Park, so that I could be closer to my father in his final stages of Lung cancer. He passed in Dec. 2017. I opened the doors to the new shop June 2018 but still had lots of parts to dispose of and/or move. I got rid of over 30 parts cars and moved the rest of the parts and cars to Estes.

The shop in Estes is fully functional, although it may take a while before I can find a specific part that I know I have, I just don't know where it is located. I still have over a dozen project cars for sale as well as my personal collection, that comprises Triumphs from a 1929 Super Seven Deluxe, to a 1981 TR8 and most of the TR's in between, as well as Spitfires, and GT6's, and a Herald. Some are drivers, others are show cars, and many still in the project stage. Current projects at the shop include a Morris Minor performance upgrade, a Jaguar XKE full restoration, a BMW full suspension rebuild, and a TR6 restoration.

Additional notes by the Editor....Kevin and Triumphs go way back, he built a TR3 model when he was 8 years old. Kevin bought a rough long door TR2 from Scotland Yard while he was a freshman at the University of Wyoming. He still has that car, although it is awaiting a rebuild at the moment. Kevin opened his shop after working at HP for 18 years, and chose not to relocate when they closed the Boulder facility. The family had a powwow about whether Kevin should follow the tech work or open the shop, and the rest is history.

A safety note for those like me who are rolling on 30 year old tires. Kevin's parents survived an accident at 75 mph in their GT6, when a sound looking but old tire threw the rubber, leaving them rolling on the slippery steel casing on a turn.



Minutes of the RMTC-LLC Board Meeting of April 1st, 2019 by Gordon Kenney, Minister of Letters

All of the voting board members were present as well as the webmaster. This was a two part meeting with the required "LLC Annual Meeting" held first followed by the general RMTC board meeting.

Prime Minister Debbie Bosler called the LLC meeting (Part 3, - management, item 5 of Operating Agreement) to order at 7:00 PM at the New York Deli News at 7105 E Hampden, Denver. She reviewed the operational aspects of the LLC and the group's finances; she indicated she will file the annual report with the State. A motion was made to modify Part 4, Financial, item 8, regarding which board members are authorized to use the club debit card. The motion offered would permit its use by some other designated board member. The motion passed by an 8 to 0 vote. There was also discussion of the issue that the Operating Agreement refers to the eight elected officers as managers but in fact the club often operates with one individual holding two offices thus reducing the number of actively voting board members to less than eight. No action was taken at this time. Debbie B. adjourned the LCC annual meeting at 7:20pm.

Debbie B. then immediately opened the monthly board meeting and asked for officer reports.

Rod T. had visited the "Cars Remembered When" facility and suggested it as a destination event. He also reported that we have a program speaker for both the April and the May meeting. It was suggested to ask Alan Magnuson to give a program on car club formations post WW 2.

Gordon K. said that draft minutes of the board meeting are distributed to all board members for correction before being published as official minutes but the minutes of the general monthly meetings are published as initially written. He also discussed the Day-Before-Fathers day event at his house; the MG club has been formally invited to this event. **Jeff H.** distributed detailed financial reports to the board members. The financial health of the club is good and bill payment and report filings are up to date.

Andrew J. showed the Hagerty Calendar for 2019 with club member Bob Becwar's TR 250 being one of the featured cars. Events reviewed included the St Francis car show, the Glenwood rally with our club staffing one check point, British Car Conclave as well as some other events. Members need to keep reviewing the published event schedule in the newsletter and on the website for the current event schedule.

David D. discussed the issue of which events to list in the newsletter and how many non-RMTC events to include. The board's guideline is to list many events so that members can find an event most every weekend. Only participation in club sponsored events are eligible for MOY determination.

Mark B. discussed the regalia ordering procedure including the \$7 flat fee for item delivery.

Kitty J. discussed the membership renewal reminder program and is following the 90 day time period of late renewals prior to dropping individuals from the membership list. The number of current members is around 110 but several of these are approaching the dropping off deadline.

Andrej G. is organizing the Spring Car Show at the local McLaren dealership on May 18th. Several of the details need to be worked out but it should be an interesting venue for the Triumph owners.

Debbie B. raised the need for the treasurer to leave the club checkbook with someone when the treasurer is out of town; it was decided the Prime Minister or the Vice PM is the designated person.
