

Minutes of the RMTC-LLC Board Meeting of May 6th, 2019 by Gordon Kenney, Minister of Letters

All of the voting members of the board and the webmaster were present. Prime Minister Debbie Bosler called the meeting together at 7:00 pm at the New York Deli News restaurant and asked for board member reports.

Rod T. reported David D. was the only one who had driven a Triumph to the meeting. He reported on the planning for the July 4th event in Evergreen and discussed some of the plans for meeting programs.

Gordon K. said that he will be editor of the "Triumph Herald" for the June issue during David's absence. He asked for all related material, including photographs, to be sent to him by the 24th of May. He and Mark B. discussed the pdf color/BW pages issues.

Jeff H. distributed a several page financial report and told how some of the issues with the Bank had been handled. He will leave the club's checkbook with Rod T. during Jeff's absence later this month. Jeff also reported the club's liability insurance policy was renewed and had a copy available for board members to review.

Andrew J. reviewed recent events and discussed details about the coming events such as the St Francis show this weekend and those related to the Glenwood MG event and our club's agreement to staff one of the check points. David D. thanked the board members for their submission of material for the newsletter and explained his arrangement with Gordon to edit the June issue. Mark B. reported the paper copies of the newsletter have been mailed and he discussed some of the problems with

the printer company due to their inexperienced staff.

Kitty J. reported that our membership count is 107. She is following the club's guidelines on dropping members who are not renewing in a timely manner but is also contacting them to encourage them to renew.

Andrej G. gave the report on the arrangements made for the car show this month. This is going to be an interesting venue for the club but does require advance registration and timely appearance. The board voted to approve a \$250 donation to the event charity.

Andrew J. has investigated the name tag supplier used by the local Miata club who can supply a more elaborate name tag and mail it directly to the member for about the same cost as we now pay. This would simplify and speed up the process; he will make a follow-up report next month.

Debbie B. asked each board member to review the responsibilities of their club office that is detailed in the By-Laws and to note any changes that need to be made. She will also update the digital copies of the By-Laws and the Operating Agreement.

The charges for classified advertising in the newsletter and on the web site were reviewed; the topic will be revisited at the next board meeting.

Debbie discussed the "Focus" of the club and asked members to bring ideas to the board meeting for issues the club should be addressing. One example discussed was the formation of a new regional coalition of British Car Clubs. The meeting was adjourned at 8:05pm.

She made note of our declining membership and how at some point it might be in the best interests of Little British Car clubs to amalgamate into one major club. She asked for input from the members present as to their views as what might be some strategies to delay or even

arrest this prospect. Among ideas presented were the notation that Northern Colorado has its British Motoring Club of Northern Colorado, and how they successfully put on their Oil Spot Rally in the fall for all British makes and models. The MGCC

has its Glenwood Rally for all makes and models, a three day event in June. Debbie cited that Ann and Ross Robbins of the Lotus club were thinking of a LBC event. We have invited the MGCC to our Father's Day picnic, It was also noted that RMTC members need to step up and organize drives and events, although we are an active club in that regard. Debbie threw out the idea of a British Car Council for the Denver area to plan/coordinate events/drives among the clubs.

Brad Reed and the RMTC won the 50-50 raffle.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:35

There were several bills introductd in the Colorado leglisature that related to cars but none of those that would have adversely affected our car hobby became law.

One that did pass related to prohibiting gasoline gars from "blocking" charging stations for electric vehicles. It's a sad commentary on our culture that such a law was necessary.
