



Some Legislative automotive bills scheduled for debate;

HB19-1067: Concerning a requirement that motor vehicle windows transmit a minimum level of light.

HB19-1207: Requiring motor vehicles to meet traction-control standards for winter conditions HB19-1300: VIN inspections performed by certified peace officer.
