He shared some valuable information and insights from his experience of buying Classic cars. For example, he explained the different "brands" that appear on car titles and what those "brands" mean. Doug has bought the rights/access to run a car title search through the recently upgraded Colorado Database, which now includes data from the title databases of other states. That means that it's possible to end up with a salvage title after running a new title history in the new database Doug extended the offer to RMTC that if you are considering buying a used vehicle, you may bring the title information (VIN) to him and he will run the car title search for \$5! After meeting with Doug, we toured the shop and showroom floor, which had a ton of eye candy! When our visit ended our group headed over to the Pint Room for lunch.





NEW MEMBER PROFILE - BLAINE TRITT

I got interested in cars by being born a male in America in the 1940s. I think it came as part of the Y chromosome. Seems boys of that era were all fascinated by anything with wheels and a motor.

When I was in high school having your own car was not a birth right as it is today. We were allowed to borrowed our parent's car on occasion. The summer after my sophomore year in college (1964) my Dad surprised me with my first TR-3 (repainted 1957 Buick silver). I don't recall the year of the car but 1st gear was not synchromeshed so my guess is a 1959. The



demise of that TR-3 is an entire story unto itself but suffice it to say I skidded on ice and had a head-on encounter with a concrete bridge abutment.

Insurance replaced that car with a powder blue TR-3 which I'd guess was a TR-3B – it was synchromeshed in 1st. Sometime in my last year in college I turned that car on its side, totaling it. My Dad thought it would be better for me to replace it with a beat up 1960 Chevy we called "Patches".

In 1970 while in the Air Force in Colorado Springs, I had a '54 Jeep wagon (the "Cracker Box") that I rebuilt in my apartment parking lot (engine, transmission, transfer case, seats, headliner, interior panels, carpet). It would top out at 55 mph on I-25 in 3rd gear! About 1984 I had an MGB but I didn't restore it. But, I never got over my love for the TR-3. For 50+ years I've been telling myself that I would have another one but there was always something else that kept it on the back burner. Recently, I'd pretty much given up on the idea.

Then, on August 26th my daughter Olivia had dropped by and I was talking with her and looking out the kitchen window when her twin brother, Aaron, drove down the driveway in a TR-3! The two of them had secretly got together and gifted me a 1959 TR-3 (titled as 1960)! Needless to say I am still overwhelmed by it. My 50 year dream is being fulfilled by my fantastic kids!

This is actually how I found the Rocky Mountain Triumph Club. The TR-3 was purchased from a RMTC member who provided the recommendation. So you might even recognize the car from this picture with its proud and happy new owner. And so the saga continues !

Additional information of interest edited from the RMTC November Board meeting and the CCCC November minutes

Edited Minutes of the RMTC-LLC Board Meeting of November 4, 2019, reported by Gordon Kenny MOL

Gordon had asked that the board prepare some guidance as to the "Member of the Year" program for the 2020 board. The discussion centered around continuing the present tedious and labor intensive system of assigning points for various activities and collecting records of that throughout the year or moving to a program where near the end of the year the board would select the member they felt most deserved recognition. This issue generated considerable spirited discussion but no recommendation was made to be given to the new board.

We all need to plan so that event postings and e-mail blasts are directed first to the Event coordinator who will work with Andrej to insure they appear in a coordinated manner. The board will ask Andrej to keep members addresses and telephone numbers from appearing on Facebook club postings.

Newsletter Publisher Mark B., reported that he mailed 41 newsletters directly to members.

Jeff H., Treasurer, distributed a multi-page financial report. He has reviewed the financial records for the past year and has "cleaned them up" with more careful categorization of entries, correction of errors, etc and by providing useful subtotal and total values. The clubs net for 2019 to date is about \$300

Collector Car Council of Colorado, Inc. (CCCC) Edited Minutes of Meeting, 6 November 2019

Guest Speaker: Matthew Groves is VP of Legal Regulatory and Compliance with the Colorado Auto Dealers Association. CADA is associated with the Freedom to Drive organization that aims to promote the right to drive private vehicles. Matthew described the current tendency to create regulatory and financial disincentives to use of private internal combustion engine vehicles, including eliminating parking places and promoting bus and bicycle lanes. He discussed a proposed program "CO Clean Air Through Reducing Emissions Fund (CO Care Fund)" that is patterned after similar funds in California and Texas. The goal would be to reduce pollution, primarily ozone precursors, by making investment in clean technology and incentivizing replacement of older heavy equipment. Funding sources proposed are fees, primarily on diesel trucks, but also on all vehicles through a "smog impact vehicle registration fee". We may hear more about this when the legislative session begins in January. Dick Thompson advised that car enthusiasts need to be prepared to work with CADA to safeguard our driving rights.

Legislative: Leo Boyle reported that there are warning signs (perhaps ignored) that promoting electric vehicles may encounter China's dominance in batteries for cars with consequences for buyers in America. Leo noted that the Colorado Legislature will resume in January with administrative actions such as forming committees and chairpersonships and by February we should see bills that are being proposed. He expects that there will be action on updating the myriad license plates in Colorado and we should **watch for changes in plates used by collector vehicles.**

2020 Air & Ground Show at Rocky Mountain Metro Airport: Management by the airport will take over parking and grounds admissions (ticket taking) and CCCC will assist with security and arranging the car show. The swap meet and car show area will be relocated and hopefully may be on grass.
