

is hopeful that we can begin the social events that are on our calendar without any further restrictions. Until then, stay healthy and keep your Triumph shiny and ready to drive.





Announcement from Mike McGuire, Minister of Membership



When a Triumph was my only car, by Jeff Heller

My First (and only) Triumph

It was 1969 and I was driving my 1962 green VW Beetle to and from UCLA where I was a graduate student studying geology. It was a great car in southern California as it got superb gas mileage and could squeeze into the tight parking spaces around campus. I loved it and the 96,000+ miles racked up under my care.

I graduated in the winter of 1970 and was offered employment with a number of oil and gas firms finally settling on Cities Service Oil & Gas (CITGO). They were headquartered in Tulsa, Oklahoma, but I was assigned to their western division located in Thousand Oaks, a 45 minute drive from where I was living. My first assignment was to conduct geological fieldwork on the North Slope of



Alaska during the summer of 1970. Needless to say I was excited as all getout. From the hustle and traffic of southern California to the remote mountains of northern Alaska, I couldn't have wished for a better way to begin my career.

In late May, along with three other geologists, I flew to Anchorage for staging our three months in the field. All went according to plan. We had two helicopters and a crew to maintain our camp, cook and pilots. Our days became routine, doing field work, collecting rock samples, measuring geologic sections, and mapping outcrops. Evenings were spent rewriting notes, checking our gear, and planning the next days work.

About midway through the summer, I was relaxing in one of the trailers at the Cape Beaufort camp after a lengthy day in the field when I spotted a recent issue of *Road and Track* magazine sitting on a small table. There were the usual collection of men's magazines but *R&T* was on top of the pile. The cover article was a review of the new 1970 sportcars: MGB, Fiat 124 Spider, Nissan 240Z, and Triumph TR-6.

After a careful review of each, actually I think I read the article several times over the next couple of weeks, I decided that I would purchase the TR-6 when I returned to Los Angeles later in the summer. Field season ended in late-August, and I returned to find an apartment near the office. It did not take long to get settled, so my search for a dealership began. I've forgotten the name of the dealership but remember it was not far from where I was living. Since I was working I drove my bug down on a Saturday morning expecting to see several new models on the showroom floor. There were none, nada. The showroom was empty. This was not a huge dealership, but not a single Triumph automobile was on display. Definitely not what I expected. As it turned out, sales had been hot for the new TR-6. I was informed that three cars were due in a couple of weeks and if I wanted to reserve one, a deposit was required.

I received a call about three weeks later telling me that the cars were in and to come down and make my selection. After work, I drove straight to the dealer and had the choice of a yellow exterior with chestnut interior and wire wheels, a British racing green with black interior or a damson with black interior. I chose the damson. Having had no expenses over the summer in Alaska and earning \$1,000/month including hazard pay, I was able to pay \$3,025.00 in cash for the car. I drove it back to my apartment two days later and have owned it ever since. It currently has just over 62,000 miles and still runs smoothly.

I gave my 1962 VW to my sister, who on driving it home to central California had the misfortune of having the engine fail leaving parts of it along the side of the freeway. It was the end of the road for my green beetle but the beginning for my new Triumph TR-6.

Altitude Compensation Unit for PI Engines_Revington TR

Who has ever seen one of these I wonder?

This is a genuine Lucas product from the period towards the end of the PI life as the world moved to Bosch mechanical systems, then Electronic Fuel Injection in short order, and Lucas got out of the game. But not before they produced a few test samples of this baby. So, what is it and how does it work?

The main two units are the Metering section and Distribution section of what we generically know collectively, as the Metering Unit, but below the Metering part there is another unit. This is the Altitude Compensation Unit. I have only ever seen two. We fitted one years ago to the ex Roy Fidler Triumph 2000 with a factory installed TR5 engine. The owner was doing a lot of mountain driving and, as we all know, or at least those of us with mechanical PI, when you get to 2,000m (6,562 feet) above sea level, the fuelling goes so rich it is difficult to drive the car and you pray to be able to get lower down again.



Clearly if you lived at these altitudes (where RMTC lives) the car would be no good to you at all. This was Triumphs mechanical solution. The capsule on the bottom detects atmospheric pressure and compensates by reacting against the metering spring pressure to lean off the mixture proportional to altitude. Simple but effective. I dare say that if PI had continued, all metering units would have morphed into a version of this.

That is not the end of the story though. The concept set me thinking, (I do a lot of that but only a bit is useful!) that I could bring the concept up to date. I have mapped out a plan to use modern electronics, a barometric pressure sensor and a pressure variation device to more accurately control the fuelling proportional to altitude, with the settings being adjustable via a laptop, or even a Smartphone. The ultimate goal will be to be able to tune the Metering unit in total via the electronics but that might be a way off yet. Watch this space.....


