

The meeting was called to order one minute late at 7:32 pm by President Dick Thompson at the ColoRODans club house, 209 Kimbark St., Longmont CO. Officers in attendance were Dick Thompson, president; Tom Mansfield, 1st vice president; Dick Fritz, secretary; and Tom Kay, treasurer. As expected, attendance was light due to corona virus concerns. 13 member clubs were signed in and everyone had masks. Since there was not a quorum present, no official motions could be made and this was considered an informational meeting.

Legislative: Leo Boyle reported that the abbreviated legislative session resulted in many bills that were originally presented simply died as the legislature had to concentrate on setting the 2021 budget, (which was mandatory), education, and police reform. Senate Bill 20-036 would have affected vehicle emission tests eliminating the "check engine light" reason for failing; this bill was postponed indefinitely (killed). Senate Bill 20-051 stated that plate's registration expired on change of ownership and the plates must be turned in but the owner has first priority to have new plates with the same letters and numbers reissued for a replacement vehicle. This bill appears to not be killed and will probably reappear in 2021.

Cruiz'n Havana and the Air & Ground Show at Rocky Mountain Metro Airport: Both of these events have had to be canceled by local authorities. This has serious consequences to CCCC's budgets since they were to be fund raisers. We will discuss re-establishing them in 2021.

Spammers and Scammers: are still at it. If you receive a request for funds supposedly from a CCCC officer, delete it as it is fraud.

Sabres' Tri-State Show: The Tri State Show that was abruptly canceled in March is rescheduled to be held October 30-31 at the National Western Complex in Denver.

SEMA Show: SEMA is still planning to hold the Las Vegas SEMA Show in November. We have received only a few requests for the complimentary passes which are available to CCCC club and SAN members; we will continue to accept applications through August. Applications should be sent to John Ehrlich, 8753 Dover Circle, Arvada CO 80005. Include name, address, email address, club affiliation, and phone number. (SEMA needs all that).

Club Drives and Drive-bys: Many clubs are planning informal drives to get vehicles (and owners) out of the garage and enjoy Colorado's highways. Just avoid Gunnison, which does not appreciate visitors.

Next Meeting: There will probably be no meetings before about October. We will rely on communications via email and USPS if we need to get the word out.

A Final Recognition of Gordon Kenney, one of our longest and most active members

As noted in the last several issues of the *Herald*, Gordon Kenney had to step away from RMTC activities, and then shortly passed away. This is our final recognition of a 23 year active member of our club. Each of those years, Gordon was a board member, or hosted tune-up sessions, moonlight drives, was a VTR judge, or had something extra for our meetings, such as a short video or slide show of mechanical interest. Gordon was editor of this newsletter, and the Jaguar club newsletter, for many years. So recognition of his contributions are an example for us all.

Gordon's words from the February 2012 *Herald*; "Some members, especially newer ones, may wonder why I am so involved in the Triumph club but never seem to be driving one. The answer is that I NO LONGER own a Triumph but have owned three over the last 20 years. My first, a TR4A, is now owned by the DeVisschers so it is still in the club. It was replaced by a 1974 TR-6 that I had for several years; it had dual Weber Carbs, high-compression head, an O/D transmission and a factory hardtop. It was a rust-free original car and had never even been repainted. It was replaced by a black 1946 Triumph 1800 Roadster which I purchased from a RMTC member and owned for 9 years. But I sold it at the Conclave in 2010 and haven't replaced it with another Triumph."

What follows is the Kenney family narration of Gordon's life and times.

Gordon Kenney, March 3, 1936 ~ June 25, 2020, Born in: Kearney, NE, Resided in: Foxfield, CO


On June 25, 2020, Gordon Neal Kenney of Foxfield, Colorado passed away peacefully at Denver Hospice from pancreatic cancer. He was born on March 3, 1936 in Kearney, Nebraska into a large family including parents Archie and Martha Kenney, and older siblings Eula, Dean, and Leland. The family moved to a farm near Corydon, Iowa when he was four, where he soon attended a one-room schoolhouse featuring an encyclopedia which he read in its entirety. It was in Corydon where he met Shirley Jeannette Hart. The high school sweethearts were married in 1956, beginning a 64-year journey together. Eager to pursue a professional career, he (and Shirley) studied at Simpson College in Indianola, Iowa, followed by the University of Kansas and the University of Wisconsin, culminating in 1965 in a Master's Degree in Radiological Physics. At the same time, he was building a family that came to include three sons: Bradley Neal (1958), Gregory Gordon (1961), and Douglas Steven (1964). After completing his studies, Gordon moved the family in 1967 to Aurora, Colorado to pursue a long career in medical physics (and program administration) at Presbyterian (later Presbyterian/St. Lukes) Hospital in Denver. Once the boys had left the nest, he and Shirley moved to Foxfield where he retired and later served as a trustee on the town council

Retirement provided Gordon with new opportunities to focus on the long list of hobbies that had long fueled his seemingly endless curiosities—especially those that spoke to his fascination with science and technology. Cars, and the many friends that loved cars, were a lifelong obsession. His affection for classic British cars was balanced by an equal fascination with electric vehicles, a passion that included serving as President of the Denver Electric Vehicle Council and his design and construction of a 3-wheeled electric "trimuter" in 1983, a precursor to the Tesla that would become his final ride. Other vehicles included a stable of sports cars and collector cars, as well as the Turquoise Tortoise—a school bus he converted into an RV that was used to take the family on several ambitious trips across the country. Other hobbies included aviation (as a pilot), photography, and anything else that fueled the imagination of his growing family, even when it required him to attend sporting events for which he otherwise had zero interest. Among his lesser known interests included napping on the couch, Tootsie Rolls, gadgets (of all kinds), dad jokes, and teaching moments. Whenever you heard him say, "You should know how this works," you knew a lesson in technology or life was forthcoming.

Gordon Kenney was a fantastic husband, father, friend, colleague, neighbor, teacher, role model, and counselor whose influence will continue long past his death. He is survived by wife Shirley; sons Brad (and wife Cathy), Greg, and Doug; brother Dean (and wife Doris) Kenney; and grandchildren Cody Neal Kenney and Casey Nicole Maring. His remains will be interned at the Cremation Gardens at Rocky Mountain Memorial Park in Aurora. The family has chosen to hold a celebration of a life well lived at the family home in Foxfield.
