#### New Garage Celebration & Fall Drive, October 11, 2020

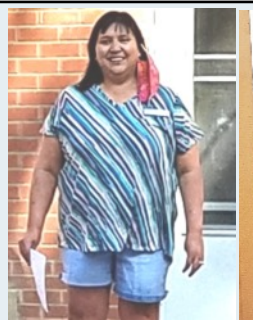
Hosted by Andrew & Kitty Janiesch

## RMTC Board Meeting October 9, 2020 reported by Brad Reed

Members Present: Liz and Brad Reed, Mike McGuire, Richard Martin, Sharon Robinson, Eric Malewska, David Durstine, Bill Gillespie and Jeff Heller. Non Board members present were Barb McGuire, Andrew and Kitty Janiesch.



This was the first meeting held since February that was not a Zoom meeting. The meeting was held at the New York Deli on W. Hampden.

All Board members called their 15 assigned members to once again try to encourage members to run for a Board position. No one received any interest in seeking a board position, at least for 2021. One member told Liz that he would be interested for a 2022 Board position. Another member stated that if no one else is interested he may seek the Minister of Letters position. It was noted that of the 115 current members, no one new stepped forward to serve on the board. This could have long term implications on the survival of the club.

**Treasurer Jeff Heller** stated that the Club is solvent, advising the Board how much is in the Club check book as well as in the CD. The CD did make a total of \$28 during the 3rd quarter of this year. Again, if a member would like to know how much is in the account(s), Jeff Heller is happy to respond to any member's phone call.

**Mike McGuire** reports that he has had two membership renewals during September, and nine new members since January 2020. There are currently a total of 116 memberships in the Club.

**David Durstine** stated that his friend Jim Schroeder has a variety of English cars, including Gordon's Triumph 1800. Jim is willing to provide a "tour" of his collection. Events Coordinator Sharon Robinson will investigate and coordinate this event for November. (Recent update-due to COVID19 considerations, this tour will be rescheduled.)

**Sharon Robinson** also advised that she is working on an event at the Forney Museum. To start, Forney is interested in displaying a few Triumphs (perhaps five or six) between 12/1 and 1/25/21. The display would be followed up later in 2021 with a larger Triumph event for the Club.

Forney also has a book club (transportation related) and sponsors drives. More information to follow.

**Richard Martin** stated that the Board should re-think the Christmas Party. There was again discussion by the Board members and the non Board members present. Due to COVID19, its predicted resurgence, reluctance and refusal of local facilities in hosting events, reluctance of our older members to attend, etc. the Board again decided to not host a Christmas party this year.

Jeff Heller brought up the issue of poor attendance at meetings and events in non-COVID times. A fair percentage of attendees are the Board members and spouses. What can we do in the future (after COVID) to encourage attendance and membership? This is an age-old question that has been discussed before by other Boards.

One suggestion was to have more guest speakers at general meetings. This was implemented in 2018 and 2019. There were several guest speakers from as far away as Colorado Springs. The speakers were advertised, and at times there seemed to be a few more members in attendance, so that was not an attendance driver. Certainly, post-COVID, we can again pursue more and/or repeat speakers. We try to keep the speakers transportation and/or automotive related. All Board members need to make a concerted effort to meet and greet new members and/or non-members who show up at general meetings and other events.

Any and all suggestions are appreciated.

The New York Deli is willing to accommodate the Club in their back room for a November 17 general meeting. They should be able to accommodate up to 20 with proper social distancing, depending upon COVID rules at the time. Meeting adjourned at 7:55 p.m.

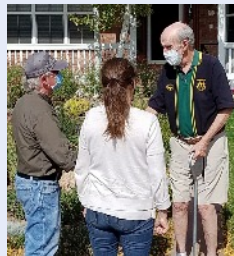

## Tech Tip, by Patrick Huckels

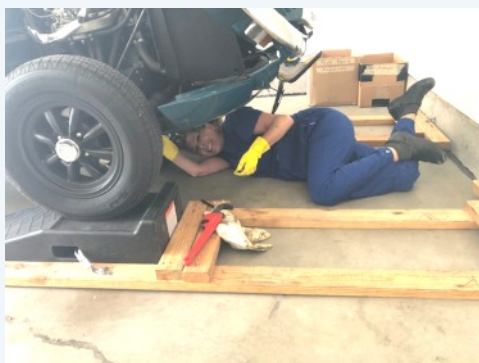
As I continue to put Leftovers back together and am now working on re-installing the dash after changing out the steering column bushings, I wanted to make sure that all the electrical connections were properly secure. The bullet connections were giving me fits so I Googled 'bullet connector tool' and found there were a few places selling it for between \$30 and \$40, Moss being one.

Since I am trying to stay on a meager budget I decided to make a small investment with a cheap 'tongue and groove' (Channellock) pliers at \$8. I then took out my grinder and made a groove in the end to accommodate the wires. Good results and the pliers can continue to serve me for other purposes.

Hope this helps someone out there on a tight budget like mine.
