Richard opened the Zoom meeting at 7:03 p.m.

- 1. Continuing payment for Colorado Sales Tax License and filing of tax report on quarterly basis
- 2. Continuing payment of annual membership in the Colorado Car Collector Club, cost for 2021 will be \$90 (reduced due to Covid-19) or \$210 (standard rate past 2 years)
- 3. Changes to be made to bring the club operating agreement up to date
- 4. Purchase Zoom access license for online meetings
- 5. Bank account access signature card
- 6. Improvements for club Facebook page



- LLC Operating agreementGordon and Debbie are still on it, update at next live meeting with signatures.
- Need to add PM Richard Martin to the bank account signature card, Jeff will coordinate that.
- Jeff has been filing a quarterly sales tax form, we have not been collection sales tax because we have had no sales since VTR 2011. Is it easier to stop filing the form and restarting if needed, or just drop it completely?
- CCCC dues have been paid, the rate is \$4/member +\$50 fee, it would be \$90 or \$160 in 2021, the board voted to continue our membership.
- We want to increase the RMTC online presence, and allow members to post to the RMTC Facebook page. Kitty Janiesch and Sharon Robinson have volunteered to assist Andrej by posting member submissions to the page. This will aid coordination with other clubs, sharing drives, etc. (More information on page 8 and 9)
- VTR Has sent another *desperate* request that the RMTC host the 2023 VTR. There have been several rounds of this discussion, and a members survey, previously among the Board and our RMTC members. In spite of the urging of several enthusiastic members, there has never been enough of a committed number for us to pull it off. So the decision was to decline hosting VTR. At some point, we may be able to partner with other British clubs in Colorado, to have enough resources to host a VTR. It was noted that the 2020 MG national meeting in CO Springs was canceled due to COVID19, as was the VTR.

Member Profile of Rod Tomkins, by Kitty Janiesch

Many of you may or may not know that long time RMTC member Rod Tomkins organized the annual club drive for Drive Your Triumph Day, which honors Sir John Black's birthday. Sir John was born in 1895 and is considered the father of Triumphs. Rod always plotted out a drive to a scenic spot to create a perfect backdrop for this annual event. One year Rod enlisted his friend, a professional photographer, to take pictures of our Triumphs over I-70, with the Continental Divide as our background. That year those photos were published in the Vintage Triumph Registry's magazine. We thought this month it would be fun to learn a little more about Rod and his love of Triumphs.

To date Rod has owned 7 British cars, 4 of which were Triumphs. The list includes a 1935 Morris, a 1950's Ford UK Consul (Ford manufactured this car in Britain as well as Germany) a 1966 TR4A, two 1971 TR6's and a 1981 TR8. Currently Rod still owns his 1971 TR6.

Rod shared that one of his most cherished memories is driving with the top down over Loveland Pass to ski at A-Basin. He had his ski's strapped to the boot and his lovely daughter Erica riding shotgun. Rod said they will never forget the amounts of head turns they received that day.

Rod has served on the board as Vice Prime Minister along with organizing many, many drives and events over the years for RMTC. Rod and his beautiful wife Judy joined the club years ago and enjoys the support and club events. Most of all Rod values all the friends he has made and loves the camaraderie.







late 14c., "success in battle, conquest," also "spiritual victory" and "a procession celebrating victory in war," from Old French *triumphe* (12c., Modern French *triumphe*), from Latin *triumphus* "an achievement, a success; celebratory procession for a victorious general or admiral," from Old Latin *triumpus*, probably via Etruscan from Greek *thriambos* "hymn to Dionysus," a loan-word from a pre-Hellenic language.
