As part of the tour led by Forney Museum Guide, Kai, we got to see the Pop Up Exhibit “Irish You were my Car.” This exhibit featured 2 green Triumphs – a 1954 TR2A currently owned by Kayle Wilhelm (this rare TR2A was previously owned by Tom & Dorothy High) and a 1978 Spitfire owned by RMTTC member Jeff Otto. These Triumphs stood out among the other huge green cars!

Kai led us through the temporary Pontiac exhibit of over 20 cars, from a GTO to a Fiero. We also enjoyed the permanent motorcycle, bicycle, and train exhibits, and learning the various histories of these modes of transportation.

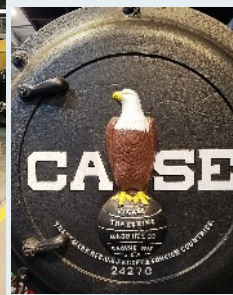

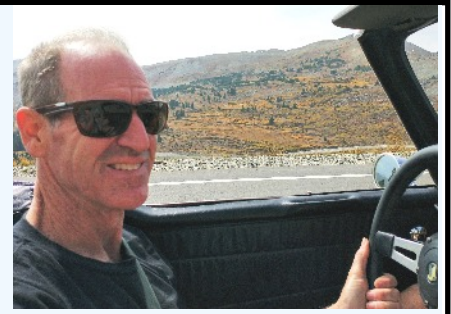

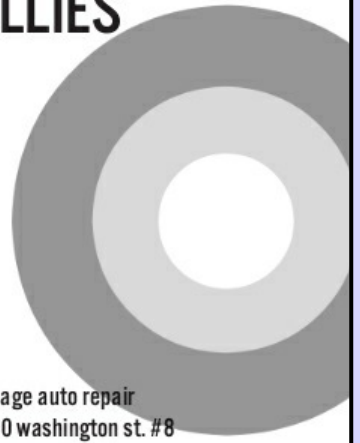

After a difficult year with the COVID-19 pandemic, the MG Car Club Rocky Mountain Centre is pleased to continue the tradition of hosting a marvelous weekend where MG owners and sports car enthusiasts of every marque (British, American, German, Italian, Japanese, and electric) come together to enjoy sunny days, cool nights, and unique events in Glenwood Springs. We invite you to join us for the 69th Annual Rallye Glenwood Springs, the oldest, continually-held, time-speed-distance rally in the United States, on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday, August 27, 28, and 29th.

The fun begins on Friday with the Tour which departs from Gunther Toody's Restaurant in Littleton, CO and finishes in Glenwood Springs. This year's tour can best be described as the intersection of *Top Gear* and *The Great British Baking Show*. Along the route, participants will demonstrate carefully honed skills required of vintage car owners and will complete a unique scored technical challenge at the host hotel afterwards.

Saturday's main event is the more rigorous time-speed-distance rallye designed to challenge both novice and experienced rallyists. The rallye departs from the host hotel in Glenwood Springs, runs through canyons and over scenic roads in the heart of the Rocky Mountains, and finishes back at the hotel in Glenwood Springs.

On Saturday evening we plan to host the Gearshift Social at the Glenwood Springs Courtyard Marriott Hotel. Attendance will be governed by CDC, City of Glenwood Springs, and State of Colorado occupancy restrictions.

The weekend's activities round out with the Car Show, Funkhana, and Awards presentation at Two Rivers Park on Sunday.

For the safety of our members and guests we ask that only those vaccinated against COVID-19, showing no symptomatic signs of infection participate, and that entrants wear masks and practice social distancing commensurate with guidelines in place at the time of the event.

New Member Profile, Coordinated by Kitty Janiesch

We are excited that **Roger & Lynda Mathis** joined RMTC in February! Roger is the new owner of a 1963 Spitfire 4 Mark I. His Triumph has been at Sports Car Craftsman getting final touches done. I wanted to share in his own words, his responses, to our Member Highlight questions:



1 - What attracted you to owning a Triumph? I love the Italian design, simplicity, ease of accessibility to engine with the bonnet coming up, the handling, and the fun of driving the Spitfire!

2 - What is your funniest memory of you & your Triumph? We had four people in my 1969 Spit cruising New Orleans with college buddies, when we noticed one of the back passengers (sitting on the boot deck with feet inside the back area) was missing. He had fallen out when we turned at a stop sign! Yes, we went back to get him....

3. How many Triumphs &/or other sports/classic cars have you owned?

Two Triumphs: 1969 Spitfire in the 70s, and now a 1963 Spitfire. Others: 1967 Mustang, 1972 Chevy Nova, 1969 Cadillac Eldorado, 1960 Austin Healy, MG Midget, VW Rabbit, 1980 Fiat Spyder, 1989 Honda CRX Si, 1991 Mercedes Benz 300SE, 2001 Audi S4 v6 Twin Turbo, 2004 Audi S4 V8, 2002 Firebird



4. What is your dream car? Current 1963 Spitfire!

5. Where are you from or any other personal tidbits that you would like to share: We hatched an evil plan in 2011 that we wanted to move from TX (where I was a dentist for 35 years), to Boulder, by encouraging our youngest daughter to attend CU Boulder. We knew she wouldn't leave and we all wanted to be in the same area, (in case of grandkids) so when she graduated, we sold everything - dental practice, my wife's psychology practice, our home of 30 years, and my bicycle collection (I kept 8 of the 35 or so bikes) - and made the leap. I retired and Lynda opened a new psychology office in Boulder. Our oldest daughter moved here as well and continues her art career. The youngest one is working in the psychology field using her degree from CU Boulder.



We've been in Colorado since July 4th, 2019. My hobbies include custom bicycle design/build of electric, gas, pedal and all things bicycle - mountain bikes, fixed gear, road, etc. I finally have time to pursue my dream of owning another Spitfire and doing all the club activities and drives. Not wanting to fiddle with the engine and transmission I chose a fully restored 1963 Spitfire with a Honda S2000 engine and transmission so I could concentrate on the fun part of driving it. Maintenance is enough of a car hobby for me! The car is currently at Sports Car Craftsmen having service maintenance, new tires, and new clutch master cylinder. Upgrades are being done to the side pipe exhaust, we are adding back the Triumph bonnet and boot letters, adding a bike rack receiver hitch, and a Mark III folding top with a new roll bar. Paul and his crew are amazing craftsmen!!



The car was Joe Curry's and has been featured in an issue of British V8 Magazine: <http://www.britishv8.org/Triumph/JoeCurry.htm> It was originally set up as an auto-crosser and he converted it to street trim to sell. I originally saw this car at a show in Texas in 2006 and happened across it being for sale through a Spitfire Facebook Group in late 2020.

Sharing the Worldwide Triumph Connection, by Richard Martin

Lo and behold, Ms. Kitty Janiesch called the PM during the third week of February, stating that a VIP was soon to be upon us, and, by the way, we'll be out of town this coming weekend. Would you please receive said VIP?

Well, with the office of PM comes responsibility. The VIP was none other than Karl-Peter Ritter, president of the local Triumph Club in Hannover, Germany. This gentleman was already known to the Boslers as well as the Janiesches. So, what could one say other than, "absolutely!".

A bit of background on Herr Karl-Peter Ritter: this gentleman is a Lufthansa pilot who happened to have a flight from Germany to Denver on Friday, 26 February, a lay over on Saturday, then return to Germany on Sunday. Herr Ritter also is the co-president of the local Triumph Club in Hannover, Germany. They are quite active, and happened to host the Triumph TR6 birthday party last year, which Mark and Debbie Bosler attended in Hannover (full story in the August 2019 *Herald*, available on the RMTTC website). They had quite the time I understand. More background: Herr Ritter has a 1970 TR6 PI, which is a Lucas fuel injected model, RHD, which he discovered in England through an internet ad, discussed with the owner, flew to England (well of course on a discounted Lufthansa ticket!), inspected the TR6, bought it, and drove it home. Ok, there was a ferry involved!



So this chap is quite interesting. Now then your PM and our guest are quite fascinated by aviation so where better to take him than Wings Over the Rockies! By a stroke of luck, Richard investigated the website and acquired tickets at the 10:30 opening! They were almost sold out for all of Saturday the 27th.

Come Saturday, 27 February, Richard met Karl in the Hilton City Center Hotel, near the Brown Palace Hotel. He met the flight crew: first officers and cabin crew and off they went to the museum. It was great to get to know one another on the drive. Sadly, Richard's Mk 2 Triumph was a bit under the weather, but there were no complaints being chauffeured about in the old BMW.

Once at Wings Over the Rockies, it was amazing to hear the comments of Herr Ritter! He has an extensive aviation knowledge, which made the visit that much more enjoyable. In fact, the two hour window which Karl and Richard were limited to barely got them through perhaps 30% of the displays! Not to worry!

The gents egressed to the Lowery Beer Garden for lunch, just adjacent to the museum. An enjoyable lunch was had. Post lunch, the "head shed" discussed our respective clubs, management, and "issues". Gruppe Hannover has two presidents vs our one PM. Not surprisingly, we both have the same issue, how to spark a bit of interest in the youth. Otherwise, our clubs seem very similar with respect to activities, etc.

After lunch, Richard asked Karl, "What else would you like to see?" He was most surprised by Karl's response: "Red Rocks!" Ironically, this was the same plan the first officers had but they were having a terrible time obtaining a rental car. Well with BMW at hand, off the pair went to Red Rocks. Karl was fascinated by the venue despite the stage being full of scaffolding during the remodel. And he took a shed load of pictures some of which are in the newsletter.

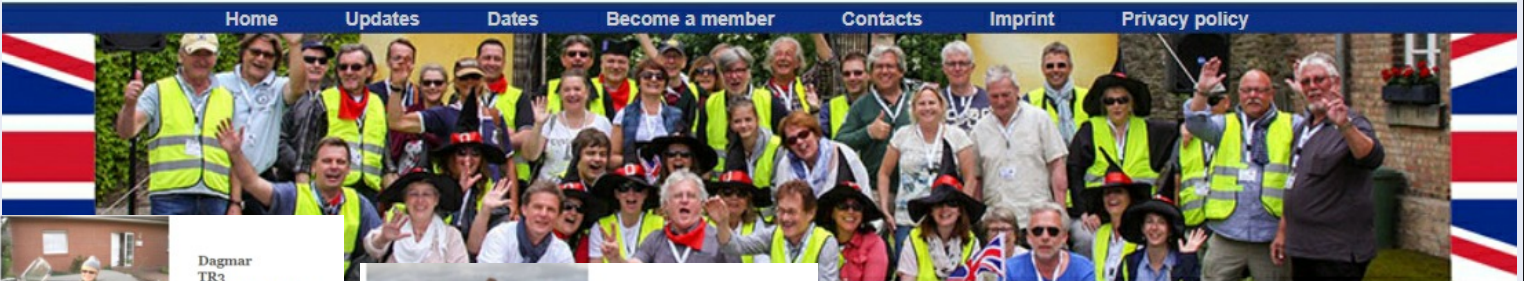
