Everyone has a story about a car they should have bought way back when. Sale ads are a little slow this month, so here is an archival version from 1987.

"Pssst, Buddy....Wanna buy an interesting Triumph?"

In addition to the many fine parts cars Scotland Yard usually obtains every month, a few examples come through that are not deserving of the typical fate. These cars are either very unusual parts cars that would help finish an otherwise difficult restoration, or unfinished project cars that require renewed enthusiasm from someone able to provide a little muscle and TLC. Some of our current inventory includes the following:

1. 1967 Trlumph 2000. This Interesting 4 door sedan, although rare in the US, is a very handsome and sturdy car that provided the mainstay of British police force in the late '60's. This unibody car used a 2000cc GT6 engine, with a beefy TR6 style transmission and Stag front and rear suspension. This example has an excellent body with no rust or collision damage but is not running because of a bad auto transmission.

2. 1968 Triumph TR250. This exceptionally low mileage car has been parked for many years, showing only 22,000 miles. The car was been taken apart for restoration many years ago, and has suffered some deterioration since. The car has never been rusted or damaged in any way, but the left rear fender suffered an unfortunate mishap, and should be replaced. The car is nearly complete but interior needs replacement. Great potential!!

3. 1980 Triumph TR8 Convertible. At only 8,000 miles, this car encountered a slower moving object, and paid the price. Not for the meek hearted, this project car requires major reconstruction, but we think it's worth the trouble. We have salted away most of the parts required to fix it from another TR8 donor car we recently dismantled.

4. 1980 Triumph TR7 Convertible. This extra clean example has a recently rebuilt engine, but now has a bad 5 speed transmission. Numerous parts have been replaced including struts, shocks, headlamp motors, top, radiator, exhaust, etc.,etc... Easily made into a top notch car, or excellent candidate for coupe to convertible conversion at a very reasonable cost.

 1959 Triumph TR10 station wagon. This unusual automobile has seen better days, but would have many valuable parts to donate to a good cause. Save it from the jaws of the crusher for less than \$100.00!!!




