


# **Open House Garage March 26th, Hosted by Les Stern**







# Shake, Rattle and Roll

# Rebuilding the Window System on a TR6, in a Weekend, Tech Article by Patrick Huckels

Let's face it Coloradans, signs of spring tease us for a few days then Old Man Winter comes back to remind us the fat lady hasn't sing, sang or sung just quite yet. Do you know that one of the top reasons for people to take their new Triumph back to the dealership for repair? Rattles. As I am trying to cure all those annoying sounds in my 6's cockpit, I thought I would share what I did to my rolling window system. I'll admit that I Googled some tips and am now creating a 'hybrid' of things I learned from the Internet, and discovered on my own. Below, I've included the links to a website and You Tube video to give you some idea of what I am writing about.

Don't spend the money on new window channels. The only really 'wearing' part is the fuzzy 'loop' channel material. The Roadster Factory just offered a set of channels for \$120 per door. Moss wants \$78 per channel. Either way you're in for \$200 + tax and shipping. How about spending a penny on a dollar and get the same results? You'll need 3 feet of 1" wide Industrial strength Velcro per door; \$18 at Home Depot for 10 feet of it. Find a cheap (like Harbor Freight cheap) flat thin bladed screwdriver and bend the tip 90 degrees. This special tool will serve both as your scraper of the old and applicator of the new fuzzy tape.

Remove interior door handles and panels. Note that there are two thicknesses to the door handle escutcheons. The thinner going behind the window crank and the thicker behind the door latch handle. Don't lose those pesky handle pins either. Remember if the spring behind the handle goes directly behind the escutcheon or behind the door panel itself. I've heard of its position being either way. I would suggest a body panel tool for the panel clips so not to break the backing board. If your car is original, you will have to lift the plastic sheeting or 'water curtain'. Mine was gone and I will glue some new sheeting on before installing the new door panels.

If you're in for a penny then spend a British Pound and change out those crusted door top seals called Waist Seals. Maybe they come up to the waist of a short person? Consider them wainscoting for your car. The seals help center your glass window and keep it from bouncing around when it's rolled up. Get a waist seal clip tool from someone and place a 'little dab will do you' (Brylcreem) of grease to hold the clip on. This will really be a test of your patience. Install the seals before reinstalling the window channels.

Before reinstalling your restored channels, check the fit between the nylon guide bushings and glass at the top with the window channel. You can crimp the nylon bushings tight against the glass to help decrease the 'play' and chatter. Place some fuzzy Velcro onto the top of the window regulator stop bracket, that Lshaped piece at the bottom of the inner door. Also wrap some electrical tape around the ends of the tie rod at the bottom of the window channels.

Lastly take some of the 'hook' (harder) part of the Velcro and place it behind the door latch 'remote control' on the door's inner face. Did you know that you can lock your doors from the inside by simply pushing the door handle forwards?

I know there are many ways to install the door handle pins but here's my way: Take an awl. Tape the pin to the end of it. Push the pin into place and wiggle the awl until the pin stays. Hopefully the tape with come out with the awl.

Now your car should have less of those annoying noises, and you might, and just might, be able to hear yourself think while cruising.

And always remember: Silly Soft Siders rollups aren't for kids.

#### Collector Car Council of Colorado, Inc. Minutes of Meeting, 2 March 2022, edited for space.

Representatives of 18 clubs and one individual member were in attendance. (RMTC members are welcome!) Samantha read the names of 17 clubs that have renewed for 2022 and urged that others do so as soon as possible.

Legislative: Leo Boyle reported via the Zoom connection on bills currently being discussed in the 2022 legislative session and which might have some impact on vehicle owners. Most have little bearing on collector vehicles. House Bill 1004 (HB22-1004) proposes a funds transfer from the General Fund to the Licensing Services Cash Fund to avoid having to raise drivers license fees. HB22-1254 concerns licensing requirements for persons moving to Colorado and then licensing their vehicles. HB22-1162 proposes authorization of "digital number plates" in lieu of the metal plates now required. Senate Bill 22-138 (SB22-138) is a very complex bill aimed at implementing greenhouse gas emissions reductions in Colorado. It puts requirements on insurance companies to add "climate-risk assessments" of investment portfolios, redefines "agrivoltaics" (yes, that's a new word), eliminates gas-powered lawn mowers etc., provides a credit for purchasers of electrical replacements for gas equipment, and tightens the GHG reduction requirements. And there's more, but nothing aimed at on-road vehicles, old or new. Leo will follow how all this moves forward.

**Car Thefts:** Car thefts are up 500% in the Denver area and that has included collector vehicles. Owners are advised to park cautiously and consider anti-theft devices. The CCCC trailer (used at the Airport Show) was stolen but has been recovered. It will now have a wireless device added that will detect if it is moved.
