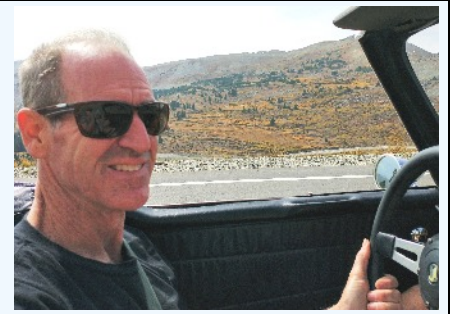

Jeff has been sending the email event blasts with the Google tool, there was discussion on how far ahead to send blasts, and do they need an RSVP attached. It depends upon the nature of the event, default is about one week out, then several days out. 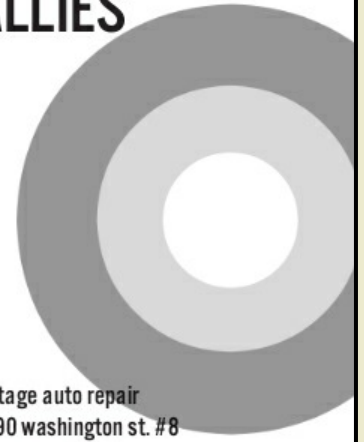

## 8/17/22 General meeting at the New York Deli News

The meeting was held at the NYDN, with 22 people and 3 Triumphs attending. (TR3, TR4, TR4)

It was a busy meeting, due to several special presentations to be made, along with the usual business. The first presentation was made by PM Richard Martin. It was an honorary lifetime membership and certificate presented to Shirley Kenney, in honor of the many events the Kenneys hosted, the numerous board positions that Gordon held over his decades of participation, and his generous technical assistance and mentoring to our membership over the years. Tributes from several members were read as Shirley and their son Brad stood to accept our wishes. There were a few sniffles as the tributes brought back some poignant memories to those who knew Gordon.



A presentation was also made to James DeBartolomeis in the form of the hard luck crutch, inscribed with the names of earlier victims of Triumph travel woes. This was to memorialize the fuel system problem that befell James' TR7 as we drive up the canyon to the highway cleanup last month. And Chuck Woodward was presented with the inscribed version of the highway cleanup plaque, won by Chuck for the best story told about the items he found during the cleanup last month. A framed and signed poster of the July ACC Car Show event poster, where Spitfires were the featured marque, was presented to Sharon Robinson, whose Spitfire was the poster car.



Board member reports were made: Jeff Heller reports that club finances are in good order and breaking even for the year. Jeff has also been test-driving an application for improved delivery of event email blasts. Blasts went to 123 emails most recently, with 68% of the emails being opened on the average. David Durstine is back from travel and expressed much appreciation that Eric Malewska did a great job on the August newsletter during that travel. We were pleased to have Jeff Otto attend the meeting while he is still in recovery from some serious surgery recently. He is unable to drive at this time, Jeff announced that he would like to ride shotgun if anyone is out on a Triumph drive, or would care to visit him at the rehab facility.



Several items came up during discussion. Since general meeting attendance has not recovered after COVID-19 restrictions are no longer a factor, even when we have a speaker, **it was proposed that general meetings be held quarterly rather than monthly.** Interim club business can be handled at some of our standing events if needed. There will be a formal vote on this matter at the next general meeting, it will take 2/3 of those present to pass. Please contact any board member if you have comments about a quarterly meeting. Copies of the applicable RMTC Bylaws were distributed for those who wished deeper information. As always, ideas on club activities and comments on club operation are always welcome.

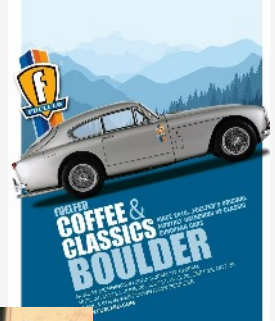
## **Fuelfed Coffee & Classics® August 28th**
