Richard opened the meeting discussing club attendance at Jeff Otto's funeral. Jeff noted prior member Marty Cohen passed away December 23 age 90 – discussed putting a note in the next newsletter. David to run the upcoming General Meeting as Richard will be out of town. Chuck will do a 50:50 raffle. Alan Magnusen will attend to discuss the Glenwood Rally and Paul Dico will discuss his El Paso raceway event. A recent tune up and maintenance have been performed by Ax & Allies. The interior features a new Moss Motors Interior Panel kit, New Moss Motors Carpet, New dash pads, New center console, New Roadster Factory Reflective Top, New seat belts, New Steering wheel, and New Moss Motors Suffolk Seats. It should be noted, the wood dash is original and is in excellent condition. Electrically, the wiring harness has been replaced with a Roadster Factory Harness. 

The meeting was held at the Rocky Mountain Metro Airport (RMMA) terminal building, Broomfield CO. Leo Boyle reported that the Colorado Legislature began its 2023 Session in January and will meet for 4 months. He expects that 400 to 500 bills will be introduced and he will be on the lookout for ones that affect the car hobby such as one advocating year-round use of E-15 (ethanol 15%) fuel which would be bad for vintage vehicles. Minutes: The minutes of the December 2022 CCCC meeting were approved as published.

Concours d'Elegance: Discussion with Tom Scott regarding the June 4th 2023 Concours in Littleton is continuing. The Concours is planning to feature evolution of the automobile with decades of vehicles grouped together. CCCC is urged to promote the show and we hope to provide 50 cars for the Evolution category. 
