Fire Extinguishers

(I am retired from 30 years in the fire service. I have had several people ask me about fire extinguishers. So here is an article that hopefully will answer a lot of questions.)

Let's start with the size. When you go shopping they have little ones, medium size ones and, if you go to the airport, they have big ones. The National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) says you should have one that is a 2A:10B:C extinguisher. Great, what does that mean? The A letter stands for fires that involve wood and paper. The B letter stands for petroleum-based fires such as gasoline and oil. The C letter stands for electrical fires or fires that have energized electrical equipment. The 2A:10B:C extinguisher would, therefore, take care of all 3 sources of fire. There are 2 other letter classifications which apply only to commercial fires. The letter D indicates fire of combustible metals (such as magnesium), and the letter K indicates commercial cooking fires. These are very specialized extinguishing agents specific to these types of fires. You would find D extinguisher agents in metal shops and K agents in commercial kitchens. As for size, some companies state the size of the extinguisher in pounds. This doesn't tell you what type of fire the extinguisher is designed for. When looking at fire extinguishers, find the letter designation. It should be listed on the label on the extinguisher. Look for one that is at least a 2A:10B: C rating. If the extinguisher has numbers greater than that rating, you are getting a better rated extinguisher. The 2A:10B:C rating is the recommended extinguisher for home, shop, and other residential uses. This rated extinguisher is also the minimum rated extinguisher for most commercial businesses. A 3A:10B:C extinguisher is fine as well. How do I use this thing? The most important rule to remember concerning a fire is to get out of the house, shop or away from the fire. Call the fire department and then, and only then, should you consider using a fire extinguisher. If you do use it, keep near a door that you can use as an exit. Stay low to avoid breathing in toxic vapors. When you exit, close the door behind you and do not reenter the building. Once you squeeze the handle of the extinguisher, it will only discharge its contents for 8 to 60 seconds, depending on the size of the unit. When using an extinguisher, sweep at the base of the flames. Aiming the extinguishing agent at the flames will not put them out. Be aware that, when using an extinguisher, the agent from the extinguisher may go everywhere. If you use it in a kitchen, you will be cleaning the walls, ceilings and floors for quite a while.

Fire extinguishers: we have heard about them, we are told to carry them, we should have them in our shop, and we should have them in our RV's and our homes. What size should they be, how do we use them and what do all the numbers and letters mean? Hopefully this short article will help explain the mysteries of these devices.



FIRE EXTINGUISHER CONT.

Where should I put the extinguisher? In the home, mount it close to an exit door so you can

grab it on your way out. Mount it in a place where it is not in the way of an exit door. In the car,

place it where you can easily get to it as you are exiting the car. For example, put it between the seats or in the back seat. The extinguisher should be inspected and recharged as indicated on the instruction sheet included with the extinguisher. Just as a suggestion, put a tag on the extinguisher when you buy it. Date the tag, and every month check the gauge to verify it is still in the "green." Check to see the hose is still in good shape and the extinguisher has not been discharged. Mark on the tag the date you inspected the extinguisher. Now comes a technical part. Every 6 years the extinguisher should be inspected internally. This inspection has to be done by an authorized fire extinguisher company, but those extinguishers that are not rechargeable do not require this inspection, but will need a hydrostatic test every 12 years. Rather than going through the expense of the testing, just replace the extinguisher every 6 years.





The Club has a Member of the Year program. There is a sign-in book at every Club -sponsored event, drive and meeting. It is important for you to sign the book when you are in attendance because this is how points are determined for MOY. The MOY program is managed by the Minister of Letters. revised November, 2017








Fuelfed Coffee & Classics®
