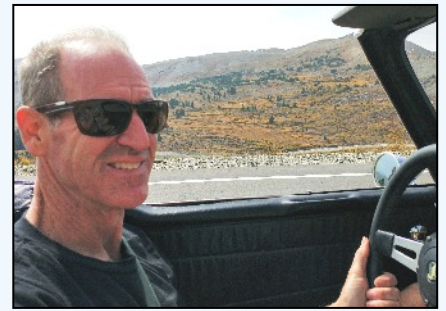

Regards were noted for those who are recovering from recent surgeries, Ralph Malewska, Terry Hughes, and Jeff Otto. Also several members who are recovering from COVID.

Annual Elections: Nominations will open in a couple months, we need You -- need new energy, new ideas. A chart of the last 14 years of board members was passed around. There has been heavy rotation of the same people on the board, we need a break! All positions are open for nominations during September-October nomination window. Elections are held in November for the next term starting in January. If not you, ask or nominate a friend in your club.

Discussed the General Meeting Location - A map of the general areas of the members, and of the members who usually attend meetings was passed around. Most of those members are in the southern metro area. About half of our members are not in the metro area at all, they are in the Springs, Boulder, and points further north, and out of state. 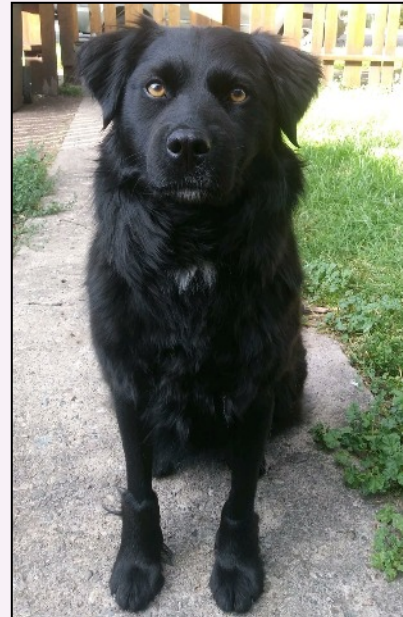

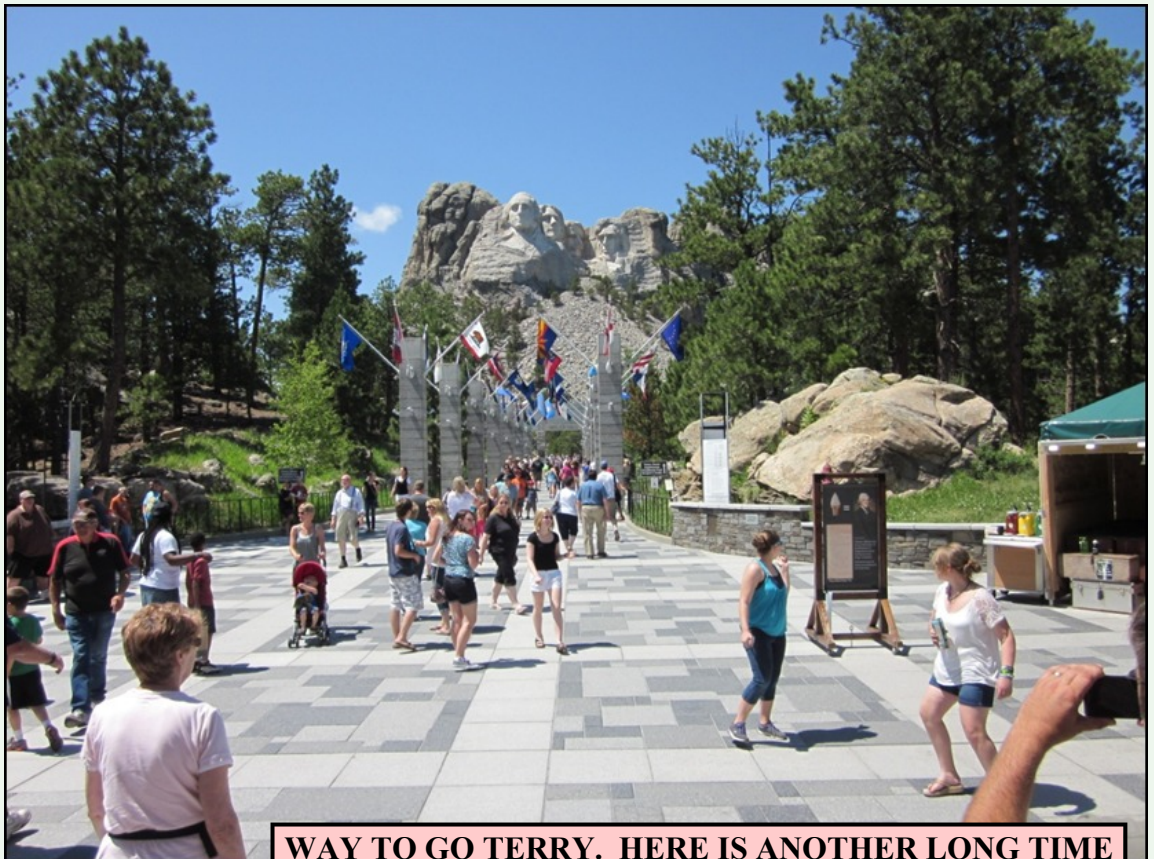
PROPOSAL FOR A BLACK HILLS GATHERING

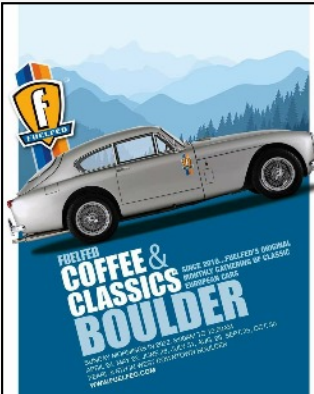
